The AP Seminar course, taught by Mrs. Lillian Rao, is the first of a two part Capstone program offered by College Board, which helps students develop critical thinking, research, and communication skills. Students analyze complex information and deliver clear, persuasive presentations, which have started this week. Sophomores and Juniors have spent the last few weeks leading up to the AP exam for this course, sharing their oral presentations. In Task 1, groups complete a research project, each member offering a different lens perspective. Topics like Discrimination of the Romani people in Europe were explored, including its historical

and current challenges while creating strategies for better representation in their communities and within political realm.

They attended a talk by the Shrines' director on the life and work of Mother Cabrini and toured several exhibits containing second class relics, defined as anything directly related to or used by the saint during his or her life. Students also had the opportunity to pray in the presence of the first class relics, which are usually blood or bone of a saint, interred under the altar during mass. The entire student celebrated International Women's Day on March 8th when they viewed the movie "Cabrini." This made the retreat more meaningful even the Sophomores.
